DISCUSS THIS

How do these passages relate to each other:

As Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw <u>heaven being torn open</u> and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. Mark 1:10.

The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. Matthew 27:51

Then I saw "a new heaven and a new Earth," for the first heaven and the first Earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, <u>coming down</u> out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Revelation 21:1-5

Revelation 5:10, "You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our God, and they will reign on the Earth."

THE NEW CREATION

DISCUSS THIS

God is not going to destroy this creation and make a new one. Instead, The New Creation is the Old Creation, healed and transformed.

For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God. (Verses 19-21)

What does it mean that the New Creation will have been brought into the freedom and glory of children of God?

What does it mean that the New Creation will have been liberated from its bondage to decay?

What does it mean that in the New Creation there will be no more sea (Revelation 21:1)?

OUR NEW BODIES

DISCUSS THIS

Where did these ideas come from about us becoming disembodied spirits floating around up in Heaven?

"We groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of **our bodies**." Romans 8.

In what way will they be similar to our current bodies?

But now Christ is risen from the dead and has become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep." 1 Corinthians 15:20

In what way will they be different than our current bodies?

Romans 6:9 For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him.

"For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we eagerly await the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will **transform our** lowly body so that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able to subdue all things to Himself." Philippians 3:20-21.

So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. And just as we have borne the image of the earthly man, so shall we bear the image of the heavenly man. 1 Corinthians 15:42-44, 49

What is the significance of the following:

The scene where the door is locked in the upper room and Jesus nevertheless suddenly appears before His disciples.

Or the various places where we see Jesus's resurrection body appearing and disappearing from human sight, at will.

"For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands..."

"Meanwhile we groan, <u>longing to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling</u>, because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life."

"Now the one who has fashioned us for this very purpose is God, who has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. Therefore, we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. For we live by faith, not by sight. We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.' "'Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.' "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full.

You refuse to come to me to have life. John 5:39-40.

In the end, God says to the lost, as CS Lewis put it, "Thy will be done."

What is the significance of the destruction of the temple by the Romans in 70AD?

And when he drew near and saw the city, he wept over it, saying, "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. For the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up a barricade around you and surround you and hem you in on every side and tear you down to the ground, you and your children within you. And they will not leave one stone upon another in you, because you did not know the time of your visitation."

From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked. Luke 12:47-48

Capernaum... if the miracles that were performed in you had been performed in Sodom, it would have remained to this day. But I tell you that it will be more bearable for Sodom on the day of judgment than for you."

Matthew 11:24
