
THE KINGDOM OF GOD I: The Kingdom of God in the Old Testament

Man is sinful and separated from God. Therefore, he can not know and experience God's love and plan for his life.


3. LAW THREE

1. Heaven

Discuss this: What is "The Kingdom of God?"
What is "The Kingdom of Heaven?"
<u>Discuss this:</u> Who is in Heaven?
What are they doing there?
Discuss this: Where is Heaven? Is it far away from Earth somewhere?
"Surely the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it." Genesis 28:16.
"Don't be afraid," the prophet answered. "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them." And Elisha prayed, "Open his eyes, Lord, so that he may see." Then the Lord opened the servant's eyes, and he looked and saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha. 2 Kings 6:16-17.

Discuss this:

Why did God make a physical creation? Why not just make Heaven and leave things at that?

Discuss this:

At the very start of things, what was the relationship of the Kingdom of God to His creation?

Discuss this:

What does it mean that people are made "in God's likeness" and "in God's image?"

Discuss this:

What is God's grand intention for humanity?

a son of man that you care for him?



How did humanity end up giving up their rule of the world to Satan?

2 Corinthians (4:4) describes Satan as "The god of this age"

3. : The Jewish Project

<u>Discuss this:</u> After humanity's rebellion, what did God do to get His original purpose back on track?
Discuss this: What were the Jewish people supposed to accomplish?
Discuss this: What was the significance of the tabernacle/temple?
<u>Discuss this:</u> Were the Jews successful or unsuccessful in their appointed role?
Abraham is the father of all who believe. Romans 4:16.
Israel was supposed to be a light to the nations says Isaiah, (Isaiah 49:6.), but he notes that, God's name is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you." 52:5

Discuss this:

What did God do to try and get the Jewish people back on track?

For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign Lord. Repent and live! Ezekiel 18:32

I have loved you with an everlasting love. Jeremiah 31:3

"Can a woman forget her nursing child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you." Isaiah 49:15

<u>Discuss this:</u> Why did God choose the Jews, if He knew ahead of time that they would fail?

Discuss this: Why didn't God send Jesus sooner in Jewish history?	
At the right time, God sent His Son, says Galatians (4:4).	
What made the time that Jesus came, "the right time?"	

5.: Why did God choose the humanity to rule the Earth in the first place?

Discuss this:

Why did God choose the humanity to rule, if He knew ahead of time that they would all fail (Adam/Eve, Jews and Gentiles alike?)

Discuss this:

What is "The Divine Conspiracy?"

Discuss this:

Given human sin and folly, how is it possible that God will have His creation beautiful, perfect AND He will have it ruled by a free humanity?

Discuss this:

"Divine Providence" means that God is in control of, and is directing history, toward a wonderful end. And yet, humans really are running the world,

How can both of these things be true?

Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out! "Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor?" "Who has ever given to God, that God should repay them?" For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen. (Romans 11: 33-36)

Discuss this:

We, who are the problem, end up as the beneficiaries of all of the efforts of Divine providence! How can that be?

Discuss this:

Paul saw that not only the good, but also the wicked actions of God's creatures were consistently being used to a good end. Evil defeats itself. Evil is always redirected, by God, to a good end. How can that be?

Joseph to his brothers: You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good. Genesis 50:20.

We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28.

Discuss this:

How is the cross "the supreme example of God's subversion of evil?"

Discuss this:

Nothing that has happened to you, or that will happen to you, good, bad, or otherwise, surprises God. It was all taken into account ahead of time when He made His wonderful plan for your life. The plan that He is right now working out, through the free decisions that you make.

Discuss this:

Doesn't that just let everyone off the hook? After all, who cares what we do, bad or good, if God will work it all out in the end?!

The Son of Man will go just as it is written about him. But woe to that man who betrays the Son of Man!
