DISCUSS THIS

"The human body matters. It is good and beautiful, and is a fitting home for the human soul.

"The created world matters. It is also good and beautiful, and is, and a fitting home for the human person."

Where do these other models come from?

DISCUSS THIS

They will say, "Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our ancestors died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation."

But they deliberately forget that long ago by God's word the heavens came into being and the earth was formed out of water and by water. By these waters also the world of that time was deluged and destroyed. By the same word the present heavens and earth are reserved for fire, being kept for the day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly.

But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up. 2 Peter 3

DISCUSS THIS

What happens when you put gold in a fire?

Their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss but yet will be saved—even though only as one escaping through the flames. 1 Corinthains 3:13-15

What was God's original **Grand Intention** for humanity?

Does the annihilation of the world fulfil the **Grand Intention**?

DISCUSS THIS

How are we co-laborers with God in bringing about the New Creation?

DISCUSS THIS

The problem with a future obliteration is that, if it is true, so many good things are going to be destroyed, and lost forever...and the loss of good things is always a tragedy.

DISCUSS THIS

Not all goodness has to do with morality.

What was Augustine's insight in this regard?...How does it relate to *Genesis 1 (God made everything, and it was good. All of it.)*? Where does evil come from?

Are trees good? Stars? Laughter? Relationships? Art?

Are they worth preserving, fighting for? Is that what Christ did on the cross?

When these good things are carried forward into the New Creation, what will be different about them there?

How does the annihilation view undermine the significance of our lives?

If God is going to take a giant eraser, and rub out the entire white board of our world, and start over from scratch, does it really matter, ultimately, in the long run, what we write on that white board?

DISCUSS THIS

How does this discussion inform our answer to the question "What about environmental concerns?" from a Christian viewpoint?

DISCUSS THIS

The larger point, though, is that the Bible is very, very insistent that each human life matters, that what we do matters, and that human history matters, in the long run.

How will the Kingdom work of Moses, for example, carry forward into the New Creation?

DISCUSS THIS

Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. 1 Corinthians 15: 58.

Why is our labor in the Lord not in vain?

God's plan for humanity is a grand plan spanning all of Old Creation and all of New Creation, linking them together.

Will any good parts of this creation be lost? And be absent in the New Creation?

What about mathematical discoveries? The work of Bach? Athletic achievements?

DISCUSS THIS

How can it be that it is often, but not always, small and insignificant people who are the most important and helpful in human history and in the work of the Kingdom of God.

Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are. 1 Corinthians 1:26-28.

DISCUSS THIS

What was N.T. Wright's cathedral analogy with the Current Creation and the New Creation?

How does this arrangement infuse our ordinary, everyday faithfulness with eternal significance and unending worth?

THE NEW HUMANITY

DISCUSS THIS

How do these two verses relate to each other?

[God's] plan in the fullness of the time, is to bring all things together in Christ, things in the heavens and things on the Earth. Ephesians 1:10

[God has appointed his Son] through whom also he made the universe, heir of all things, Hebrews 1:2

Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and <u>co-heirs with Christ Romans 8:17 All things are yours</u>, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours, and you are of Christ, and Christ is of God. 1 Corinthians 3:21-23

"He who overcomes <u>will inherit all things</u>, and I will be his God and he will be My son. Revelation 21:7

DISCUSS THIS

Because we will inherit all things, we are going to need to take care of all things!

"If any of you has a dispute with another, do you dare to take it before the ungodly for judgment instead of before the Lord's people? Or do you not know that the Lord's people will **judge the World**? And if you are to judge the World, are you not competent to judge trivial cases?" I Corinthians 6

"If we endure, we will also reign with him." 2 Timothy 2:12

DISCUSS THIS

What is the Beatific Vision?

DISCUSS THIS

How does the Beatific Vision relate to wonder?

Wonder is "a feeling of surprise mingled with admiration, caused by something beautiful, unexpected, unfamiliar, or inexplicable."

DISCUSS THIS
